Winter Workshops at GHF

Ready, Set, Grow: Expanding Our Co-op: With Karen Brodeur, Michael Norris CHF Canada and Glenn Furlong, CMHC

This seminar explored how housing co-ops can tackle the current housing crisis by expanding their footprint. As co-op growth has stalled over the last 30 years, the "Ready, Set, Grow" initiative provides a roadmap for bringing co-op principles to more people.

Key Strategies for Growth:

- The Essentials: Expansion requires two main ingredients: land (or property) and secure funding.
- Strength in Numbers: Interestingly, growing larger co-ops are easier to secure the finances professional help and resources needed to grow even further.
- Creative Conversion: Growth isn't just about new builds; it includes possibly acquiring commercial spaces and converting them into residential co-op communities.
- Expert Support: CHF Canada provides the navigation and help toward financial backing necessary to help co-ops manage these complex developments.

Workshop Spotlight: Compassion Fatigue Who takes care of the caretakers? With Sonia Byrne

This recent seminar explored the reality of Compassion Fatigue? The exhaustion we feel when supporting family or serving on demanding boards and committees.

Key Takeaways:

- Share the Load: Burnout happens when a few people carry everything. True community requires everyone to participate.
- Set Boundaries: Learn to say "no" to unrealistic expectations. If you try to meet everyone's demands, you lose yourself in the process.
- Unplug from "Perfection": The internet often shows a false version of life. Don't measure your worth against someone else's curated feed.
- Self-Care is Vital: Mindfulness isn't a luxury; it's a necessity. You cannot pour from an empty cup.
